Notes/variations: 2-step turn can be substituted with walk-walk for beginners or those with vertigo. Rolling vines can be done in the first 8-count. Twisters and the Wizard of Oz. I hope you enjoy the little tributes to these that I have included in the dance (the heel clicks, the wizard steps, the 2-step turn (a tornado) & the K-step for Kansas.
